I'm a resident of the KC Metro area on the Kansas side, and I'm writing for two reasons:

1. To demand justice for Donnie Sanders, who was killed by KCPD on March 13, 2020. Release the names of his killer(s) and bring them to justice. I am so angry about the continued police killings of black men and boys all over our country, including KC, and the continued impunity of the guilty officer.
2. To demand cutting the budget for KCPD and begin immediately working for an ethical reallocation of funding towards social services in underserved communities.

Years of law enforcement officials escalating violence, the recent response to the protests for the death of George Floyd, and the deaths of Donnie Sanders, Ryan Stokes, Cameron Lamb (and many others) have shown that police are ill equipped to handle the needs of this city. We must, instead, invest in underserved communities of color. Some options may be increasing funding for community based initiatives like affordable housing, healthcare, employment, education, after school programs, and counseling. Most importantly, ask the members of our most underserved communities to find out their greatest needs.

We must move our attention and funding away from policing and toward sustainable, long term solutions that work for all of our citizens. We must get justice for the innocent lives lost at the hands of the KCPD.

Housing insecurity does not get the same kind of press as food insecurity, and everyone in the metro--rich and poor alike--seems to understand the need for a reliable source of food and supports worthy causes like Harvesters and faith-based and other food pantries and kitchen who serve those who "have not" in the metro. Housing insecurity, in contrast, tends to receive bad press. Those facing eviction or foreclosure are billed and treated like criminals. They are subjects for the courts, as if their needs and lacks in terms of housing were matters of personal choice and failing. The KC Regional Housing Alliance represents a group of individuals--landlords and property owners--who, true, will suffer inconvenience and temporary loss of income if a true rent moratorium is imposed and honored.
